If no regeneration is secured, after the above procedure has been tried, or if the set does not oscillate at the higher waves, increasing the "B" battery on the detector plate will usually give regeneration over the full range It is often the case that the proper

value of the grid leak has not been chosen. When too low a resistance is used, regeneration is prevented. With some detector tubes regeneration may be aided by wrapping the grid and plate leads together for a short distance. This increases the tube capacity. With reflex receivers, which, depend
